MINIMUM DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR NON-**CONVENTION VESSELS**

(ISC Circular No.3.R1)

Notice

Attention to all Ship Owners / Managers / Operators / Agents

Purpose

This Circular is issued to inform all relevant parties that International Ship Classification, hereinafter referred to as ISC, will require all Non-Convention vessels to have a minimum set of documentation available for inspection during surveys.

Contents

The minimum documentation required are:

- 1. General Arrangement Plan
- 2. Stability Information

These documents shall be provided to ISC for review and endorsement. They shall also be kept up to date on any changes and modification done on the vessel.

Application

This circular is applicable for:

- 1. All new and existing vessels, regardless of year of build, engaged on international voyages;
- 2. Less than 24 Metres (79 feet) in length;
- 3. Less than 150 tons gross;

Vessels that meet the above requirements are required to have these documentations by their next Annual or Renewal Survey, but not longer than 36 months from last Annual or Renewal Survey.

Exceptions

The circular, unless expressly provided otherwise, do not apply to:

- 1. Ships of war and troopships
- 2. Pleasure yachts not engaged in trade
- 3. Fishing vessels

Exemptions

As per the International Convention on Load Lines, 1966, Article 6, certain exemptions maybe granted by the Administration.
